Saturday 5th February 2022 Peterborough Masonic Centre any concerns that members may have while offering gentle encouragement and assistance, especially by way of opportunities along that 'pathway-of-enhanced-personal-development'.

Over the next few weeks and months, we will all see, in differing ways, the roll-out of the new and updated 'Members' Pathway'.

Within the Pathway it re-emphasises the relationship between the Craft and the Royal Arch with that indissoluble link between Craft Freemasonry and the Royal Arch. Together they constitute "Pure Antient Masonry", as stated in the Preliminary Declaration of the Book of Constitutions.

The **Royal Arch** is therefore the completion of this journey in Pure Antient Masonry.

References to it as the completion of the Third Degree have been removed, because the lessons of the Third Degree are fully concluded within that ceremony. However, it states that a Master Mason's knowledge of Pure Antient Masonry cannot be considered complete until he has finished his journey and been **Exalted** as a **Royal Arch Mason**.

Formal introduction of the Royal Arch can take place when the Master Mason is presented with his Grand Lodge Certificate. The introductory leaflet to the Royal Arch can also be presented. However, it is expected that the 'Four-Stage' masonic journey and the role of the Royal Arch in the completion of that journey will have been clearly explained to all long before this point, even prior to Initiation. The importance of completing this journey was also confirmed by the Grand Master, HRH the Duke of Kent, as the First Grand Principal of the Supreme Order of the Holy Royal Arch, in his Address to Supreme Grand Chapter in April 2019.

More comprehensive information on introducing the Royal Arch for Lodges and Chapters, as well as further bespoke guidance, will be forthcoming in the form of a separate and dedicated 'Pathway for the Royal Arch'.

Yet within the current 'Members' Pathway' we see reference to **Solomon**, but this may need to be further enhanced when we are meeting new individuals, as well for all Companions in their own 'pathway-of-enhanced-personal-development'.

For everyone – not only those new to masonry but for all Companions and Brethren – there is a Webinar presentation in **Solomon** entitled **'How to Use Solomon'**. After logging in to **Solomon** the link for this Webinar is:
