Hermes will enable Scribes Ezra to perform the majority of what is presently paper-based tasks online, directly updating the Adelphi database. Hermes will assist and guide Scribes through their administration tasks to ensure all records and requests are in order.

To facilitate the implementation of Hermes a Provincial Steering Group has been formed and is already working to ensure a smooth roll out.

As Chairman of this group, I am delighted to say we have some very experienced brethren and companions working together to ensure consistency of approach between the Holy Royal Arch and The Craft. The roll out programme will be supported by one team with two specialist Champions, one for each order, to assist with those areas of difference in terminology or approach. For the Holy Royal Arch this will be E Comp Del Pearson Third Provincial Grand Principal, who's day job is as an IT Consultant, so he is well-qualified to assist. He will be supported by the Provincial Grand Scribe Ezra E Comp Mike Binsted. Any questions in the first instance in relation to Hermes should be sent via the HRA Provincial Office.

The roll out of this new system will be managed in stages. Scribes will be asked to ensure all their data and their members' information is current and as up to date as possible. If you have moved house, changed your phone number or email address please ensure you let your Scribe know as soon as possible. You should also keep them updated with any future changes. This will ensure you are kept informed of everything that is going-on within your own Chapter, and also at Provincial and National levels.

Scribes will be receiving further details and all the necessary training in the new system, to ensure a smooth roll-out and implementation of this exciting new initiative, which will make everyone's life much easier and ensure all data and communications are kept as up to date as possible.

From the membership survey some time ago, which effectively brought about the creation of Solomon – which is not a website, but rather a computer system that uses web technology – it transpired that members of the Holy Royal Arch were much more aware and desired more in the way of learning and personal development in terms of gaining further insights and knowledge of Freemasonry.

During our masonic 'closedown' the Solomon Learning & Development Team have been working with energy and enthusiasm to assist you with new materials and information.

Yet it is recognised that there are still many masons who have not managed to log-in, register and set up a Solomon account. The Solomon Team have now set up an easy-to-access and convenient way for you to 'get-on-board'.

Simply go to Solomon at <https://solomon.ugle.org.uk/> and scroll down a short way where you will find in the middle of the page a link which is entitled 'Getting Started with Solomon'. At this point just click on 'Enter' and you will be taken to a page which will guide you through the process to 'Create an Account on Solomon'.

There is much to view and discover in Solomon but to highlight a few items which may generate some interest for you and may also be useful for discussion and amusement in any Zoom meeting you may be holding for your respective Teams.

Within Solomon there is a new 'Mentor's Corner' which can be found at <https://solomon.ugle.org.uk/course/view.php?id=101>. This section of Solomon will be especially useful for Mentors and Preceptors as in there can be found some ideas and materials to be used during on-line meetings with suggested presentations and quizzes, which may easily fit for on-line meetings.

Where the Companion is not involved in, or comfortable with, such on-line meetings the material presented in Solomon can be read and will in any case be a delight, and build that individual's personal Learning and Development portfolio.



PSA Home Testing

Craft Brethren and Royal Arch Companions in the Corby catchment area have been invited to apply for a PSA home testing kit. Working with the Graham Fulford Trust, the joint Craft/Royal Arch initiative aims to allow its members from that cohort the opportunity to test themselves, with the Provinces funding approx 50% of the cost.

E Comp Mike Green, PGStB, PProvGChStwd is again running this batch of testing. At the time of printing, 56 members have taken up the offer.



One area that might interest is the information on Famous Freemasons. This can be found again in the Mentor's Corner section of Solomon which is located in the 'Share and Encourage' section which is accessed from the first page of Solomon once you are registered and have an account to access Solomon.

Lastly, for every Companion there is within this 'Share and Encourage' section a dedicated area for those in the Royal Arch. Within this Royal Arch area you will find many Presentations and Demonstrations on so much in our Supreme Order. There is included here, for instance, a delightful PowerPoint presentation for you to view on the 'Principal Banners of the Royal Arch'.

Hopefully in this time of 'masonic-rest' Solomon will keep and develop your interests as we look forward with significant hope and positive expectation for a return to our masonic activities and enjoyment – especially and particularly in the Holy Royal Arch.
