



In Memorium WBro Michael John Amps PAGDC, PPGSN; 1932 - 2015

It is with great sadness that the death of WBro Michael Amps is announced. He died on Thursday 5 March 2015 at the age of 82 years after being in bad health for some time.



A pillar of both Oundle Freemasonry and the local community in general he was a successful and much respected local businessman, having taken over the family grocery business from his father, Percy Amps. Michael developed it into a very successful wine merchants

As a young man he was a keen and much accomplished sportsman, playing for both Northamptonshire County Cricket Club and Northampton Saints Rugby Football Club.

At the age of 60, he decided to take up kick boxing and regularly attended the gym.

In his spare time he was a keen gardener and boasted that he did not grow anything he could not eat. He was also an enthusiastic caravanner and named his house "Navarac" (caravan spelled backwards). A supporter of his church he was instrumental in raising large sums for church funds.

He loved to visit New Zealand where he had family, and did so each year. He spoke about it so enthusiastically (and often) that in St Wilfrid Lodge there was a rule that he would be fined £5 for every mention of New Zealand.

The Antient and Original Ceremony of the Passing of the Veils

The Antient & Original Ceremony of the Passing of the Veils will take place at our First Principals' Chapter in Northampton on the 3rd September 2015.

Full details have already been extensively circulated – firm reservations are now well in excess of 200. For those who have still to make their booking and would wish to do so, time is beginning to run out; the clock is ticking.

After the Act of Union in 1813 between the two opposing

Grand Lodges at that time – the Antients and the Moderns – unification negotiations continued well into the 1800s as all manner of differences between the two parties were gradually addressed. A mood of disquiet, even mistrust continued to prevail, so much so that in the 1830s, the Antients were advised to drop the Ceremony of the Veils from their exaltation ritual by the Grand Chapter Rulers at that time.. Surprisingly, the Antients conceded without too much resistance, much to the bitter disappointment of a small number of Antient Lodges and "Provinces".

Gradually over the ensuing years, even they had to conform...except for the

Province of Bristol. They held firm.

And to this very day, the Antient Ceremony of the Passing of the Veils has remained an integral part their exaltation ceremony. The Rulers eventually granted their approval, no doubt reluctantly, so that for the last 250 years or so the Veils Ceremony in its original format has remained the preserve of the Province of Bristol, and Bristol only.

Aren't we fortunate therefore to be able to host the demonstration team from Bristol for a rare demonstration of this rather special and unique ritual; it should be some occasion!

News from other orders

Ferrers Lodge of MMM no 1341 – Rushden – installation of Bro. W Barrie Hall

On 27th January, 2015, the Ferrers Mark Lodge Installation Meeting was honoured by a Team Visit by the Provincial Grand Master, R.W. Bro. £35,000 donation to SHINE

The Freemasons' Grand Charity is a grant-making charity dedicated to supporting people in need, having donated more



than £120 million since 1981. We provide grants totalling nearly £8 million each year in the areas of: medical research, support for vulnerable people, youth opportunities, hospice services, air ambulances and disaster relief; as well as providing assistance to Freemasons and their dependants in financial need.

Shine, a national charity that specialises in supporting people who have spina bifida and hydrocephalus, has received £35,000 from The Freemasons' Grand Charity. This grant will fund the salary of a Development Coordinator who will manage the **Shine4OPlus** project.

Shine4OPlus will allow people over 40 to share their experiences; providing daily social interaction, comfort, and vital information about managing their condition and looking after themselves.

Speaking about the donation, Jackie Bland, Chief Executive of Shine said,

"We are extremely grateful for the support given by The Freemasons' Grand Charity. This generous £35,000 grant will fund the post of a Development Coordinator for the Shine4OPlus network for one year."
